

IU DEPARTMENT OF RADIOLOGY DRESS CODE RECOMMENDATIONS

PURPOSE:

To outline standards of personal appearance expected of radiology residents providing patient care at Indiana University School of Medicine and its affiliated hospitals.

GENERAL STATEMENT:

Personal appearance is an important component of professional demeanor. Each resident is expected to dress in a manner which conveys a professional image and inspires confidence in patients and colleagues. Apparel should be consistent with each resident's duties.

SPECIFIC STANDARDS:

- A visible ID is required at all times.
- Scrubs may be worn when on a procedure based service (e.g., IR, University Ultrasound, Methodist CT/US, Methodist GI, Wishard BX) and during night/evening call hours. Scrub shirts must be tucked-in at all times. Hospital approved shoes are required. White coats are to worn over scrubs when not in a procedure.
- Business casual attire is recommended for all predominantly reading room rotations.
- Shirts with collars, such as golf-type shirts, are acceptable. Long or short sleeved shirts and sweaters are acceptable.
- Jeans, t-shirts, sweatshirts, and short skirts are inconsistent with a professional image and are not permitted at any time.
- Dresses/blouses with low-cut tops, bare shoulders or bare backs are not appropriate in the healthcare environment.
- Please use good judgment and dress appropriately, neatly, and professionally.
